Synonymy

In the European Union, Muscat à petits grains roses is officially called by other names: Moscatel de Grano Menudo Rojo (Spain) and Roter Muskateller (Germany). These synonyms are officially recognized in France regarding plant propagation material.

Regulatory data

In France, Muscat à petits grains roses is officially listed in the "Catalogue of vine varieties" on the A list and classified. This variety is also listed in the catalogues of other Member States of the European Union: Germany and Spain.

Description elements

The description corresponds to that of Muscat à petits grains blancs except for the berry skin color when ripe, which is pink in this case. The berries are sometimes slightly obloid.

Cultivation and agronomic skills

Aptitudes are similar to those of Muscat à petits grains blancs. Muscat à petits grains roses however appears to be a little bit earlier.

Clonal selection in France

The only certified Muscat à petits grains roses clone carries the number 1172.

Phenology

Bud burst: 2 days before Chasselas.

Grape maturity: early-season, 1 week after Chasselas.


Technological potential

The bunches are small to medium in size and the berries are medium to large. Muscat à petits grains roses produces wines with a comparable quality of those produced with Muscat à petits grains blancs.


Susceptibility to Diseases and Pests
