## Cultivation and agronomic skills

Areni is a fairly vigorous variety with a semi-erect bearing. It grows well in light, well-drained soil. This variety is not susceptible to severe winter frosts.

There is no certified clone for this variety yet.

## Phenology

Bud burst: same as Chasselas.

Grape maturity: mid-season, 2 weeks after Chasselas.

## Technological potential

The bunches are medium-sized, conical, moderately compact, and sometimes winged. The berries are also medium-sized and very bloomed, with a thin skin and a simple flavor.

It produces deeply colored red wines, known for their quality and aging potential. In its country of origin, Areni is used to produce dry or semi-dry wines, as well as wines intended for distillation and sparkling wines.

## Susceptibility to Diseases and Pests

Areni is very sensitive to downy mildew, a little less to powdery mildew.
