Clonal selection in France

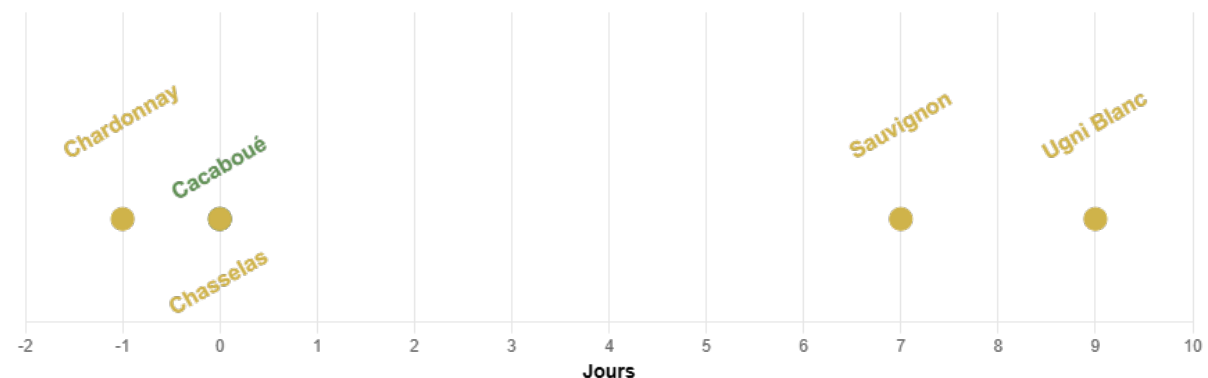
There is no certified clone for this variety yet.

Phenology

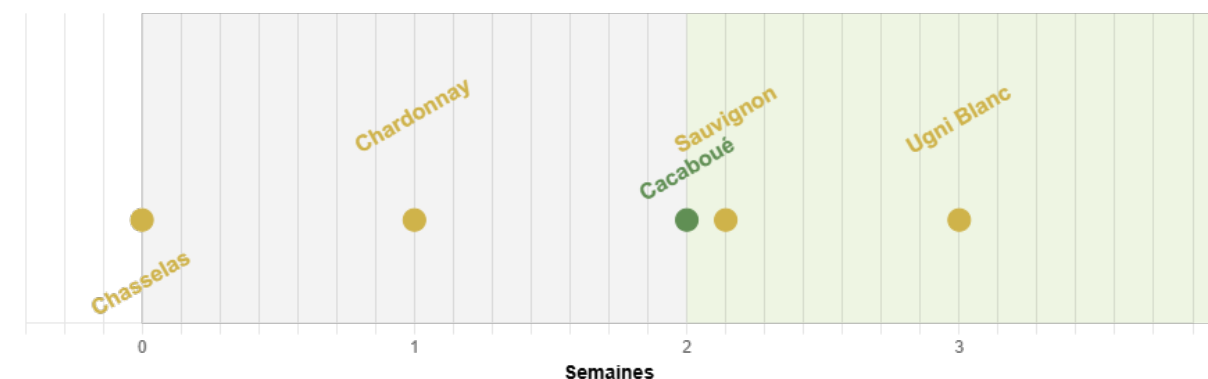
Bud burst: same as Chasselas.
